GUIDELINES FOR APPLICANTS CARLO ALBERTO FELLOWSHIP IN ITALIAN STUDIES

The following guidelines are intended to help applicants prepare their application:

1. The Collegio is the primary hosting institution and recipients for the purpose of their research can spend part of their time at one or more of the participating research institutions.¹ During their visit, they will be asked to give a presentation of their work.
2. Fellows might be invited, on the request of hosting institutions, to teach classes at the graduate level. They will participate in seminars and other activities of the hosting institution.
3. From 2 to 3 junior and from 2 to 3 senior fellows will be selected each year. Salary will be in the range of 2 to 3.000 euros gross per month for junior fellows and 4.000 to 6.000 euros gross per month for senior fellows.
4. Fellows may apply for research grants to cover research-related costs (including travel and accommodation for short research stays outside the hosting institutions) as well as for research assistantship. Junior research grants will be up to €500 per month maximum and senior research grants will be up to €1.500 per month maximum.
5. The program will cover a roundtrip flight US-Italy up to a maximum of €1500 euros. Lodging and traveling in Italy are not covered by the program, unless they are related to research activities (see point 4).
6. Not all hosting institutions can offer lodging facilities to the fellows, but all can help in finding appropriate accommodation.
7. Fellows will be provided office space and access to libraries and all other facilities of the hosting institutions.

8. Fellows will be asked to report in all publications related to their research stay in Italy that the research was made possible, in part or *in toto*, with the help of “the Collegio Carlo Alberto Research Fellowships Program.”

9. The fellowship is administered in monthly installments. The last installment will be paid upon submission of a detailed report of activities to the Collegio. Fellows will also be required to write a working paper containing the results of their research activity in Italy within 3 months from the end of their stay. The paper will appear in the Collegio Carlo Alberto Fellowships in Italian Studies series.

10. Applications are evaluated by a committee composed by Fabio Armao (Università di Torino), Pierangelo Isernia (Università di Siena) and Maurizio Viroli (Collegio Carlo Alberto). Once an applicant is selected for consideration, details will be negotiated with the Collegio in order to complete the procedure. Applicants are expected to start working no later than one year after the initial communication of the applicant to be considered is issued.
