Keynote speakers

Massimo Riccaboni

Prof. Riccaboni is the Director of LIME and AXES (IMT School for Advanced Studies, Lucca), and Visiting Professor at MSI (KU Leuven). His researchs in Economics of Innovation and Industrial Dynamics have ranged from Pharmaceutical Economics, to the use of Network Analysis tools to enquire International Trade. Before joining IMT, Massimo Riccaboni worked in many other Italian universities and visited, among others, Carnegie Mellon University, Stanford University, and the University of Boston. He holds a PhD in Economic Geography from Sant'Anna School of Advanced Studies, Pisa and a Master degree in Economics from Bocconi University, Milan.


Giovanni Marin


Dr. Marin is an Assistant Professor at DESP, University of Urbino. He is also Research affiliate at SEEDS, an interuniversity research centre on Ecological and Environmental Economics. His research focuses mainly on Environmental innovation, with an extensive use of patent data, and environmentally extended input-output tables. Before joining the University of Urbino, Giovanni Marin was Post-doctoral researcher at IRCrES-CNR, Milano, and at OFCE-SciencesPO, Sophia Antipolis. In 2011, he also visited the Department of Economics, University of California, Berkeley. He received his PhD in Economics from IMT School for Advanced Studies, Lucca.


Ernest Miguelez

Dr. Miguelez is a Research Fellow at CNRS, attached to the GREThA, University of Bordeaux. He is also Research Affiliate at AQR-IREA, External Research Fellow at CReAM, and he has been Early Career Editor of the journal *Regional Studies* (2015-2018). His research interests focus on Economic Geography, Innovation Economics, Migration, and Intellectual Property. He is currently working on the TKC project, funded by the ANR. He received the PhD in Economics from the Department of Econometrics, Statistics, and Spanish Economy of the University of Barcelona.

The dinner will take place at the *La via del sale* restaurant, in the city center of Turin, near Piazza Castello. The restaurant aims to link the Piedmontese and Ligure traditional kitchens, that, since ever, have met and clashed in Turin.

The menu will let you have a taste of a wide variety of Piedmontese traditional meals and a selection of local wine. A vegetarian menu will be provided. Other variations in the menu for personal needs can be provided. Food allergies and intolerances will be managed by the staff of the restaurant. We will ask you about these things in the registration form.

Starter	Vitello tonnato della Coalvi alla moda vecchia	Cold, sliced veal covered with a creamy, mayonnaise-like sauce that has been flavored with tuna
First course	Gnocchi di patate di montagna in crema di Castelmagno d'alpeggio	Mountain Potatoes Gnocchi with cream of Castelmagno (Piedmontese ancient DOP cow cheese)
Second course	Rollata di coniglio grigio di Carmagnola all'Arneis e olive taggiasche con patate al forno	Rabbit roll cooked with Arneis wine and Taggiasca olives, with roasted potatoes
Dessert	Panna cotta alle nocciole e Bonet	Panna cotta (sweetened cream thickened with gelatin and molded) aromatized with hazelnut and Bonet (Pudding-like ancient piedmontese dessert made of eggs, sugar, milk, cacao, rum and almond paste)

Turin city tour and wine tasting

For those who would like to stay in Turin also Thursday 10 night it will be possible to have a brief sight-seeing tour of the city (Piazza Castello and the Royal Palace, Piazza San Carlo and, maybe, the Mole Antonelliana).

We will also have a wine tasting (with some appetizers) around 6pm for whom would like to join. That activity is not part of the Workshop and so it is not covered by the fee.



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
